METHODOLOGICAL FRAMEWORK

- Identification of key infomobility measures that the project partners could share and where they would wish to gain good practice
- Include 54 sub-measures under 10 headings (groups of measures)
- Full range of measures from legislation and regulations through to specific ICT applications such as access control

PT INFORMATION MEASURES

1. PT LEGISLATION AND REGULATION

Static and real time data/information (centralised/decentralised, linking of data providers schedules, stops etc.)

Multimodal PT planner implementation (journeys, connections etc. - availability of PT data for commuters and other users)

Advisory or statutory information (tarifs, enforcement etc.)

GIS mapping (linking GIS map levels with public transport services localization)


Big events and incidents management (incl. measures for other exceptions)







CURRENT, DESIRED AND INVESTIGATED MEASURES AT PARTNERS










GOOD PRACTICES SEARCH RESULTS

 33 good practices from around Europe









ANALYSIS OF MEASURES

THE MEASURES CLASSIFIED IN 5 GROUPS TO ANALYSE THEIR POTENTIAL:

- Public Transport and/or Multimodal Information Systems
- Public Transport Fleet Management Systems
- Public Transport Interchanges
- Public Transport Priority Systems
- Public Transport Payment Systems

Multi-actor multi-criteria analysis giving weight in pairwise comparisons: POLITE consortium achieved **OBJECTIVE RESULTS IN IMPORTANCE** of the five measure groups above and their sub-measures.









GOOD PRACTICES EXAMPLES

GOOD PRACTICE FROM THE UNITED KINGDOM, BY READING:

 Information in real time service is deployed and proven, with punctuality of usually 65-95% during transmission



GOOD PRACTICE FROM THE CZECH REPUBLIC, BY CDV:

 Multimodal journey planner IDOS for public transport with information on timetables, connections and linked services for travellers.
